Happy Fall Season!!! 2022 has been an exciting year for your neighborhood association, the Windom Community Council (WCC). We started 2022 with a bang, as one of the Minneapolis neighborhood associations who got their City contracts fully funded and Equitable Engagement plans approved.

The 2022 Windom Equitable Engagement Plan is our flagship outreach and civic participation program. It guides our organization's best efforts to reach and serve all of our Windom residents, including our renter community and those representing BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) residents and New Americans living in Windom.

Two of our proudest 2022 accomplishments are 1) first ever Neighbor Greeting/Door Knocking Event and 2) Board DEI (Diversity, Equity and Inclusion) Training which was facilitated by DeYoung Consulting.

Please continue reading this newsletter to learn more about what we in turn learned from visiting you in our various Windom neighborhood 'zones.' In the Spring of 2023, we plan to continue door our knocking efforts throughout Windom.

2021 - 2022 ASSOCIATION KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Windom Hennepin County Safe Housing Initiatives: Successful collaboration with Garfield/Harriet residents and Hennepin County on the purchasing and re-purposing of the Metro and Aqua Inn Motels.
Windom Renter Engagement: Windom Gables Somali renter surveying to begin the process of connecting with our Somali residents.
Windom Door Knocking/Neighbor Greeting Events: Board Members door knocking the neighborhood to learn from & connect to you.
Windom Neighborhood Safety Rebate Program: Over \$10,000 in up to \$500 individual grants provided to Windom homeowners to help make their homes safer through the purchase of security equipment.
Windom Alternative Garden and Bioswale Program: Over \$35,000

in financial sponsorship to Windom homeowners to install alternative gardens and bioswales to help keep our waterways cleaner.

Windom Home Improvement Loan Program: Over \$219,000 in 0% APR home improvement loans to Windom homeowners.

Windom Business Facade Program: Over \$20,000 in grants to support our Windom small businesses to improve their facades to attract more local business from 2018-2022.

Windom School PTO Partnerships: Provided sponsorship aide to the newly started Windom Community School PTO in support of their Spring Festival and 2022 Kids Earth Day.

Windom Garden Technical Consultations Program: Over \$2,500 in sponsorship support to help Windom homeowners plan for alternative and pollinator gardens and bioswales for a greener sustainable future.

SUMMER 2022 DOOR-KNOCKING

As part of our 2022 WCC Windom Neighborhood Equitable Engagement Plan, over the summer, the Windom Community Council (WCC) Board of Directors implemented Windom's first Neighborhood Greeting/Door-Knocking Event.

This summer WCC was able to walk 3 of the 6 neighborhood 'Zones.' See the graphs and data below. The purpose of this initial neighborhood door-knocking was two-fold. It was used as both an opportunity to connect with our neighborhood residents and to identify the most pressing issues affecting each block in the neighborhood.

This effort will be ongoing from now into the spring and summer of 2023. It will include outreach and door-knocking into our apartments and rental properties throughout the Windom neighborhood. In this round of door-knocking, 372 homes where reached. We had about an overall 25% open-door or greeting rate. Over 95% of those who opened their doors to greet us live in single family homes and/or townhouses/duplexes.

With neighborhood larceny on the rise in Windom, the WCC used this opportunity to identify our Windom neighborhood Block Club Leaders. We have learned that our Windom Block Club is active in some but not all parts of the community. Many Windom neighborhood blocks are sorely in need of Block Club leaders. Below are some of the take-aways that will be used to shape and develop new neighborhood programming.

- Public Safety is the number one concern at the block level in the 3 Zones.
- Neighborhood Building Events are a sorely lacking in Windom, with many new renters, residents and homeowners feeling disconnected.
- Speeding & Traffic issues dominate concerns by residents requesting traffic calming measures at the block level.
- Residents are interested in more current and frequent (print and electronic) Communication on neighborhood ongoings.






ZONE 5 - CENTRAL WINDOM
