Becky McIntosh (Incumbent)

I am interested in continuing to serve the Windom neighborhood as a board member. I have been on the board for eight years and have served as treasurer for most of that time. The city has made significant changes in expectations for all neighborhood associations in recent years that I feel have strengthened the WCC as a small nonprofit organization, and strongly focused our efforts on reaching more of neighborhood residents that haven't traditionally been engaged with WCC (with particular emphasis on renters).

I retired from the city and have had extensive experience in City administration and finance, which significantly helped WCC during the recent years of transition. This past summer/fall I participated for the first time in door knocking along the blocks by my house. It was a pleasure to meet so many neighbors and gather information on community assets and needs/concerns that are informing the WCC priorities for community action. Patricia Soulak (Incumbent)

I have been an active member of the Windom Community Council since 1999-so have 24 years of service. I have served several times as President, Vice President and been on the Events Committee active in organizing the Windom Fall Festival, Windom Tot's Rock, Windom Reads, Harvest Moon Dance, 1st Windom Garden Walking Tour. I have ensured the continued relationship between Windom School, Park and Council by implementing Windom Reads 13 years ago as a member of the Windom Shared Use Committee. I have also been in the Nicollet Avenue Renovation Plan in 1999-2000, the Lyndale Avenue Street Renovation Community Committee (LASRCC) in 1999-2001. I was also engaged with getting Windom businesses to advertise on our quarterly WCC newsletter with advertising income totaling \$2,000 annually. I am able to handle and negotiate conflicts over my past 20+ years on the board.

Last summer I was involved with the Windom Door Knocking Project to ask fellow my neighbor opinions, get feedback and encourage participation in our Windom Council, even on a committee level. I had good responses on my immediate 6 block area and enjoy engaging with people. I believe in thinking outside the box to be innovative and creative with ideas for events, fundraising, community organizing and engagement. Our outreach is a continuing process and I want to be engaged in the Windom Renter Engagement this summer.

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Dembo Darboe (Incumbent)

Last fall, I volunteered at a major recycling event for paper shredding and old electronic equipment disposal.
